

National Institute of Nursing Research's GRADUATE PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM For Graduate Nursing Students

CALL FOR APPLICANTS

The National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR) invites nursing students who are currently enrolled in a PhD program to apply to the NINR Graduate Partnerships Program (GPP) in Biobehavioral Research. Working in conjunction with graduate schools of nursing, the NINR GPP offers cutting-edge, doctoral-level research training opportunities within research programs at laboratories across the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and conducted by leading scientists and clinical investigators. This training is focused primarily in the areas of symptom biology, symptom management, tissue injury, and genetics.

A graduate nursing student selected to become an NINR GPP scholar completes initial coursework at the partnership university (up to 2 years, depending on curriculum requirements). Following this coursework, the scholar comes to the NIH campus in Bethesda, Maryland, to begin research toward a doctoral dissertation. This research is conducted under the guidance of both an NIH intramural investigator and the partnership university mentor. Research opportunities for NINR GPP scholars available through NIH range from basic laboratory science to clinical trials.

Financial Support

NINR will support GPP scholars for up to 5 years. Funding for scholars includes:

- support for tuition and fees
- a stipend
- health insurance
- a small travel allowance
