Women who have stillbirths have a 4-fold higher risk of severe maternal morbidity.

HIV Testing and ART Adherence Among Unstably Housed Black Men Who Have Sex with Men in the United States

AIDS Behav. 2019; (11):3044-3051 PI: Ronald D. Stall

Homeless African-American gay men were more likely to have been tested for HIV than housed counterparts, but had more difficulty adhering to antiretroviral treatment (ART).


