- **Fellowships:** Through the Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Awards (NRSA) program, NINR supports nurse scientist training that develops skills to conduct nursing research through individual and institutional predoctoral, postdoctoral, and senior fellowships. NINR supports the following NRSA mechanisms: F31, F32, F33, and T32.
- Career Development Awards: NINR provides career development research training opportunities for nurse scientist professionals in early career and faculty positions. NINR supports the K01, K23, K24, and K99/R00 Career Development Awards.
