



# ADVANCED RESEARCH PROJECTS AGENCY FOR HEALTH (ARPA-H)

- New agency proposed to improve the government's capabilities to speed research that can improve the health of Americans.
- Included in FY2022 budget as a component of the NIH
- Tasked with building high-risk, high-reward capabilities to drive biomedical breakthroughs to revolutionize how we prevent, treat, or cure a range of diseases, including cancer, infectious diseases, Alzheimer's disease, and others
- Will use the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) as a model to establish a culture of championing innovative ideas in health and medicine.





- Proposes additional \$330 million for health disparities research, including \$20M for NINR



    - Request for information



### NARCH FOA (Native American Research Centers for Health, NOT-NR-21-003)

- For the first time, NINR has joined this announcement
- NARCH supports opportunities for conducting research and career enrichment for health needs prioritized by American Indian/Alaska Native tribes/tribally based organizations
- NINR is supporting a study to increase the research capacity of community nursing, behavioral/mental health, and public health leaders at the Fort Belknap Reservation in Montana to help reduce health disparities among the Aaniiih & Nakoda tribes

### TRAINING/PATHWAYS REPORT UPDATE

<u>PATHWAYS REPORT</u>: "NINR should advocate for funding models that enable optimal participation in a PhD program, post-doctoral fellowship, or early career investigator training with special funding to reduce the need for outside work and for older students who may be balancing family and work."

 Action: NINR raised the caps for requested salary for K01 and K99 applicants to \$100,000 per year

<u>PATHWAYS REPORT</u>: "Undergraduates should be <u>encouraged to enter doctoral programs early in their careers or directly after graduation.</u> Availability of streamlined programs, such as BSN-to-PhD, MSN-to-PhD, and DNP-to-PhD could facilitate the path to doctoral programs."

 Action: NINR joined the NIH F30 program that provides support for students at institutions with dual-degree training programs - Will allow support of nurse scientists pursuing joint DNP-PhD







### NINR Research Subjects - Race




### NINR Research Subjects - Ethnicity



### NIH Investigators - Race







### NIH Investigators - Ethnicity








